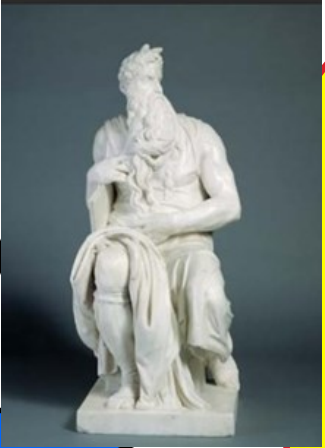


Year 4 Knowledge Map ~ Art - The Book Based Project



She was a Black American sculptor, of mixed African-American and Native American (Ojibwe) heritage

Edmonia Lewis was the first professional African American and Native American sculptor.



She was orphaned at a young age and reportedly lived with her aunts, who nicknamed her Wildfire.

Mary Edmonia Lewis Nampeyo

Edmonia Lewis' work explored religious and classical themes.

The money she earned selling copies of the bust allowed her to sail to Rome, Italy, where she mastered working in marble.

Edmonia Lewis' first notable commercial success was a bust of Colonel Robert Gould Shaw.



- Mary Edmonia Lewis Nampeyo**
- Born in Upstate New York on July 4, 1845
 - Her parents died when she was very young
 - In 1864, she created a sculpture of Colonel Robert Gould Shaw, the white commander of the all-black 54th Massachusetts Infantry Regiment.
 - Lewis moved to Rome, Italy in 1865, an international centre at the time of writers, poets, and artists, to continue her studies.
 - Some of her most famous works included *Forever Free* (1867) which depicted a black woman and black man celebrating the Emancipation Proclamation
 - *Hagar in the Wilderness* (1868), a sculpture of an Egyptian handmaiden
 - *Old Arrow Maker and His Daughter* (1872) which showed Native Americans
 - *The Death of Cleopatra* (1875) which was eventually acquired by the National Museum of Art in Washington, D.C.
 - Edmonia Lewis disappeared from public view in the 1880s.
 - Her last known sculpture appeared in 1883.
 - She died in London, England on September 17, 1907.

Science



reflection	A reflection occurs when a ray of light hits a surface and bounces off.
shadows	A shadow is formed when an object blocks out the light. The object must be opaque or translucent to make a shadow.
light source	The main light source for Earth is the Sun. Some other luminous objects give out light, for example, torches, candles and lamps.

- A force is a push or pull that causes a change in speed, direction or shape.
- Some forces are affected by speed, other forces are not.
- All forces come in pairs, no force exists by itself.
