



Evolution and Inheritance

Animals and plants produce offspring that are similar but not identical to them.


In the same way that there is variation between parents and their offspring, you can see variation within any species, even plants.

Adaptive traits are characteristics that are influenced by the environment the living thing lives in. Inherited traits are inherited from the biological parents and include things like eye colour, hair colour and the shape of your earlobes.

Art Maria Sibylla Merian

Maria Sibylla Merian (April 2, 1647 – January 13, 1717) was a naturalist and scientific illustrator who studied plants and insects and painted them in great detail. Her careful observations and documentation of the metamorphosis of the At first, Merian was a botanic artist - someone who drew realistic and detailed pictures of plants. Afterward she studied insects, keeping her own live specimens. She made detailed, scientific drawings showing insect metamorphosis, in which all life stages of the insect were shown in the same drawing.



History

Freedom

Between the 16th and 19th centuries, European merchants transported an



estimated 12.5 million Africans across the Atlantic to work in slavery in the Americas. This was known as the Transatlantic Slave Trade.

1562: Sir John Hawkins was given permission by Elizabeth I to begin transporting captured African slaves to America. There they were sold. He is called the "father of the slave trade".
1789: Olaudah Equiano published autobiography.
1807: The Slave Trade was abolished in England.
1833 : Slavery was abolished in the British Empire.
1960s: Black Americans still do not have equality with white Americans. Martin Luther King campaigned to change this.
2009: Barack Obama was elected as the first African American to be elected President of America

2012: Malala Yousafzai was shot on a bus on her way home after taking an exam.
