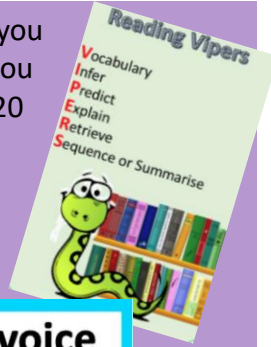

Active voice

Tells us what a **person or thing does**.
The subject performs the action (verb) on the object.

Subject + verb + object

- Example:**
- Anna painted the house.
 - The teacher always answers the students' questions.
 - Ali posted the video online.

Passive voice

Tells us what is **done to someone or something**.
The subject is being acted upon.

Object + verb + subject

- Example:**
- The house was painted by Anna.
 - The students' questions are answered by the teacher.
 - The video was posted online by Ali.

To celebrate Eucharist means being united as one community.

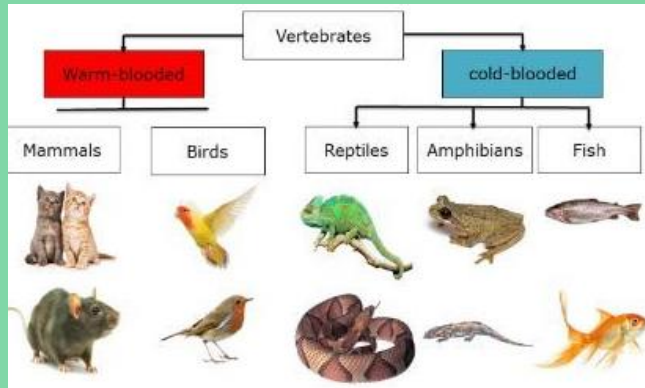

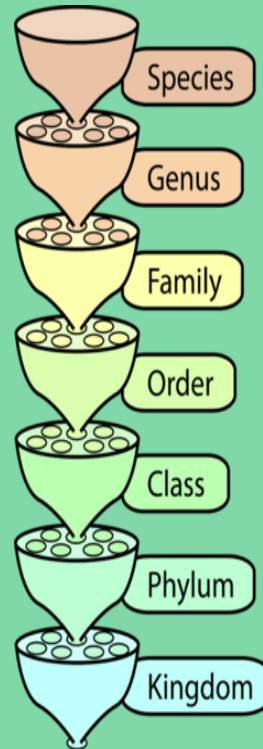
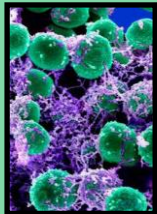
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Science

Microorganisms are very tiny living things. They are so small that they are not visible to the naked eye, so a microscope is needed to see them. Microorganisms can be found all around us. They can live on and in our bodies, in the air, in water and on the objects around us. They can be found in almost every habitat on Earth.

Member of the genus Homo with a high forehead and thin skull bones.

Primates with relatively flat faces and three-dimensional vision.

Mammals with collar bones and grasping fingers.

Chordates with fur or hair and milk glands.

Animals with a backbone.

History

Battle of Britain

World War 2 was a battle between two groups of countries – the 'Allies' and the 'Axis'.

The major Allied powers were Britain, France, Russia, China and the United States.

The major Axis powers were Germany, Italy and Japan. Adolf Hitler, together with the Nazi Party, wanted Germany to rule Europe.

To gain more land and power, on 1 September 1939 German troops invaded Poland.

After Hitler refused to stop the invasion, Britain and France declared war on Germany – World War II had begun.

During the course of the war, German forces advanced through Europe.

By the summer of 1941 they had invaded France, Belgium, Holland, Luxembourg, Denmark, Norway, Greece, Yugoslavia and the USSR.

Life changed dramatically for Britons during the war.

World War 2 officially ended on 2nd September 1945.

During World War II, he was commissioned by the War Artists Advisory Committee to make drawings of people in London using underground stations as bomb shelters.

The scratchy dark drawings powerfully capture the feelings of anxiety that people must have felt.
