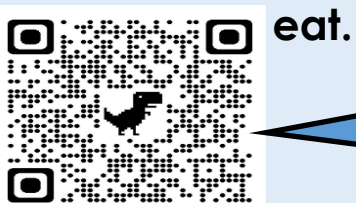

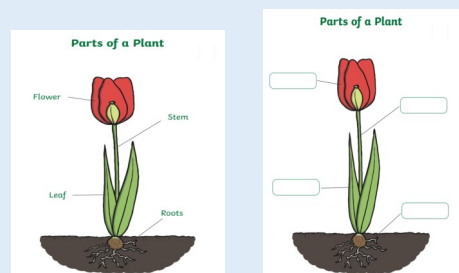

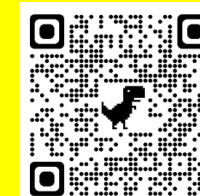


DT
