Year 4: Pentecost 1

PSHE :

Children will review Jesus' parable of The Prodigal Son. This parable shows that God loves us, and nothing we can do will stop him from loving us.

Through the story of the two brothers, children will learn about different types of sin, and the importance of forgiveness in relationships.

Challenge: Think of a word that includes a prefix and write it in a sentence.

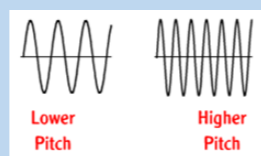
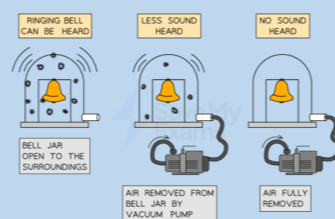
Science:

This term, we will learn about sound and how we hear sounds.

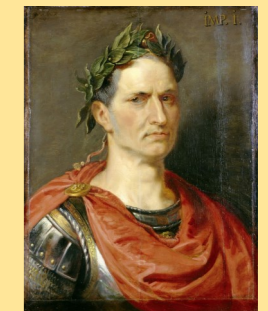
How does sound travel from the source to our ears?

Does distance from the sound source impact on the volume of sound heard?

- Frequency** How many sound waves there are per second.
- Amplitude** Amplitude is a measure of how loud or quiet a sound is.
- Sound wave** Vibrating forms of energy that are made of molecules and look like waves.
- Decibel (dB)** The loudness of sound is measured in units called decibels (dB).
- Pitch** The pitch of a sound is how high or low the sound is.



History:



- Who is Julius Caesar?
- Why did the Romans invade Britain?
- Who is Boudicca and why is she a well-known historical figure?

Did you know that:

- When the Romans came to Britain, they helped us by creating roads; a written language (which was Latin); introducing coins and even introducing rabbits to our country.
- A legend tells that Rome was created by two brothers, Romulus and Remus who were abandoned after they were born.

Maths

Multiplication:

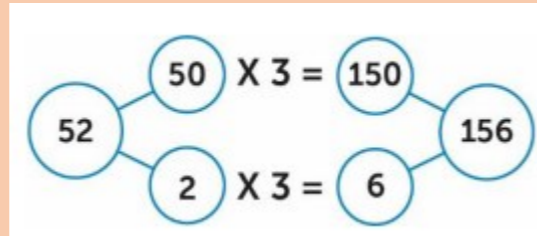
Children will learn about regrouping of a 2-digit number and multiplying each part by a multiplier before combining the products.

For example:

$$52 \times 3 = 156$$

$$50 \times 3 + 2 \times 3 = 156$$

The product of 52 and 3 equals 156

Try to read a variety of fiction/non-fiction books! Have you read any poetry recently?

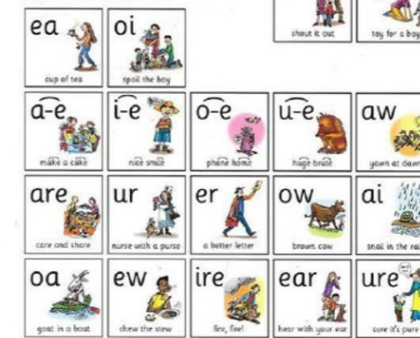
Please make sure you are retelling your story, asking questions about your books and any tricky vocabulary found inside!

How might the Holy Spirit guide Catholics to fulfil our roles in Catholic Social Teaching?

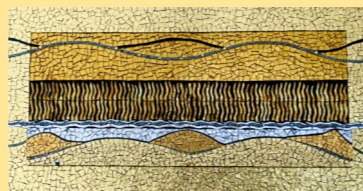
**Heavenly Father,

ART: Mosaics

- What is a mosaic?
