## St Margaret of Scotland Catholic Primary School

This term we will be studying the three themes of Domestic Church (Family), Baptism and Confirmation (Belonging) and Advent and Christmas (Loving). Each class will approach the themes through different topics. The children will also spend a week studying Judaism.

Domestic Church – Family Yr2 Beginnings – God is present in every beginning Yr3 Homes – God's vision for every family Yr4 People – The family of God in Scripture Yr5 Ourselves – Created in the image and likeness of God	At home Look through your family photo album. Try to find photos of all the significant family members – grandparents, parents, children, aunts, uncles etc. who show God's love.	
Baptism and Confirmation - Belonging Yr2 Signs and Symbols – Signs and symbols in Baptism Yr3 Promises – Promises made at Baptism Yr4 Called – Confirmation: a call to witness Yr5 Life Choices – Marriage, commitment and service	At home Talk to someone who has been to a Baptism and/or Confirmation about their memories of this celebration.	
<b>JUDAISM</b> Pupils will study various aspects of Judaism for one week. Ask them what they have been learning about.		
Advent/Christmas - Loving Yr2 Preparations – Advent: preparing to celebrate Christmas Yr3 Visitors – waiting for the coming of Jesus Yr4 Gift – God's gift of love and friendship in Jesus Yr5 Hope – Advent: waiting in the joyful hope for Jesus, the promised one	At home Discuss with the children how your family welcomes visitors to your home. Find out about some Christian symbols for Advent, e.g. Advent wreath, calendar, Jesse tree. Use the CAFOD ( <u>http://www.cafod.org.uk/</u> ) or Missio ( <u>http://www.missio.org.uk/</u> websites to get a religious Advent calendar.
